PAYMENT OPTIONS

- Payment in full on the first day of class
- 2 installments: 50% on the first day of class; 50% on the second day of class
- 4 installments: 25% on each day of class
- 12 installments: paid over the course of the year; payment must be completed at the end of the year

STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES

- Students will be expected to honor any financial commitment outlined by their local campus.
- Students will be expected to attend all class sessions, and on time.
- Students drop one letter grade for one unexcused absence.
- Missing two classes (for any reason) results in an incomplete and requires a retake.
- Students may attend another campus to make up a missed class, if this option is feasible.

- Students are encouraged to preview course notes before each class.
- Assignments will be submitted based on the instructor's preference.
- Acceptance of late assignments is at the discretion of the instructor.
- The campus administrator should be the first point of contact for non-instructor issues.

GRADING & ASSIGNMENT GUIDELINES

- Instructors will generally use the following criteria for grading your written assignments:
 - 20% Purpose (your assignment addresses the subject matter)
 - 20% Accuracy (you use supporting facts and correct grammar)
 - 30% Clarity (your thoughts are presented in an organized way)
 - 20% Format (you use proper formatting and meet the required word count)
 - 10% Punctuality (your assignment is turned in by the deadline)
- The content of your writing assignments must be your own material. Any materials from books, other publica tions or the internet must be placed in quotation marks, and the author of this material must be identified.

LIFE EXPERIENCE CREDITS

- Life Experience Credits are important to well-rounded training, as you put into practice what you have learned in the classroom. Generally, a Life Experience Credit represents a minimum of 5 hours of ministry involvement in one of the following categories:
 - 1. Missions personal ministry efforts outside the local church
 - 2. Personal Evangelism personal efforts to reach the unsaved
 - 3. Local Church Involvement personal involvement in the local church
- Students must earn 6 Life Experience Credits (2 in each category) in order to obtain a 2-year Associate's Diploma, so it is recommended that you complete 2 credits (a total of 10 hours) in each of your 1st, 2nd and 3rd semesters in order to process your Diploma in time for graduation.
- Students must earn an additional 6 Life Experience Credits (2 in each category) in order to obtain a four-year Bachelor's Diploma; so it is recomended that you complete 2 credits in each of your 5th, 6th and 7th semesters in order to process your Diploma in time for graduation.
- When you complete a Life Experience Credit, you will need to log on to the website at www.purposeinstitute.com to record your experience. Your campus administrator will approve the experience before it is added to your transcript.
